LLIAM ANNAMD who headed our Move Beotian I noticed this morning the obituary of your father, HAROLD MORTON ANNAND.

You may be aware that one of Nova Scotia's Premiers over 100 years ago was named ANNAND. I have heard it said in my youth in our home that that particular man was a cousin of my grandfather. JAMES FARQUHAR.

is at all knowledgeable in these things please I have tried to search out some connection without success. The above JAMES FARQUHAR was a native of Birnie, which is a rural area just outside Elgin, Scotland. He was born there in a little sub-section of Birnie called Thom's Hill in 1843. He came to Halifax in 1883 and ved to Brooklyn, Hants Co. the next year.

I believe that the ANNAND family came from an area very near Elgin. Thus, any connection had to be in Scotland.

I have one clue that I have not tracked down. I chatted one day with MRS. DONALD COOLEY of Halifax a couple of years ago ... a person I have known practically all my life. Her maiden name was MARY ELIZABETH ANNAND. I discussed all of the above with her and she did not have any further knowledge. However, she did recall that her branch of the ANNAND family may have had some connection with the RUSSELL family one of the RUSSELLS operated a restaurant at the Willow Tree in Halifax back in the 30's and 40' and perhaps the 50's too. One of my forefathers, I note from

our family history, married a RUSSELL back in Scotland in the 1700's... she, I think, would be my great-great grandmother.
