Your name is a very familiar one -- IF your ancestors came from Shelburne County!!! The historical complex at Shelburne even has a ROSS MackAY home (pronounced MackI - not MackA). This person was one of the original settlers of Shelburne -- could be 76th Reg't. and if so, United Empire Loyalist.

At present I am attempting to ascertain if our FARQUHAR ancestor was a member of one of the early regiments -- coming to Shelburne 1783 and if so, Loyalist ties.

You did not mention which brother, Donald, Ronald, Eugene or Clyde Farquhar -- I am assuming you spoke to Donald Farquhar, my oldest brother, lives in Dartmouth, NS.

You are in luck, and with a bit more information, you will have a family drawing courtesy of Malcolm MacDonald, our Farquhar genealogist who gave me as much as he has to date. I will put this on a separate sheet and forward to Allan Dunlop, PANS.

I am listed as a "Family Researcher" and will hopefully soon be working on my Certified Genealogist Canadian certificate. Families and their history are "fun" for me -- I hate bingo!!

In January, 1994 I printed two books, now listed with National Library of Canada, Ottawa: The Huskins Family, 1750-1993 and Extracts: The Diary of Simeon Perkins, 1766-1812. The diary extracts are only good for researchers, not for general use, unless from Liverpool area.

Also I have The Farquhar Family, Queens County, Nova Scotia but to date it does not have a real beginning, any further back than 1814, except through the other sides of the family: Hagen, Hauptman.

I sincerely hope the enclosed information has been helpful, and if so, please forward any known data to me, and I will add it to your file.
