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UNDERSTANDING THE LOYALIST HERITAGE

Historical Excerpts

By Muriel M., Farquhar Davidson

A family history tracing ancestry back to Loyalist status leads one to more and more research in order to understand WHY, HOW, WHEN they left established homes:

UNITED EMPIRE LOYALISTS, Pioneers of Upper Canada,

- Pg. 125 The Revolutionary War for the Independence of the United States of America actually came to an end at Yorktown, Virginia. On October 19, 1781, Lord Cornwallis, outnumbered by the combined forces of Washington's army and his French allies under Rochambeau, surrendered to General Washington.
- Pg. 118 Who were the Loyalists? Some of the refugees were lawyers and clergymen. Others were traders and merchants. . . graduates of Yale and Harvard universities, but the majority of the Loyalists consisted of farmers and townsfolk whose fathers and grandfathers had come from England or part of Continental Europe, and who had been taught at home and in school to "fear God and honour the King." To uphold their beliefs and remain true to themselves, they were willing to endure hardships and sacrifice all they had . . of different religions . . from every walk of life . . one thing they had in common was their loyalty to the Crown.
- Pg. 9 The Loyalists left their well-established homes in the American colonies to be scattered in various parts of the globe -- some because they were forced to leave, some because they sought adventure, and many because they cherished an ideal.
- Pg. 16 After the war, the thirteen colonies did not consider themselves one nation . . thirteen individual governments and called themselves not "Americans" - but "Virginians, Pennsylvanians or New Yorkers".
- Pg. 150 Some of the first Loyalist settlers . . were the Mohawk Indians.
- Pg. 110 Colonel Banastre Tarleton's Loyal Cavalry became legendary heroes of the light cavalry. Tarleton (1754-1833) became one of the most feared men in the British Army to the rebels. Tarleton's unit suffered heavy of fine officers and veteran soldiers . . to escape with only one hundred horsemen.

- Pg. 110 A provisional treaty was signed Nov. 30, 1782; final treaties in ten more months. The victorious Americans had independence, the Loyalists had vague clauses in treaties. . . "The War never occasioned half the distress this peace has done to the Unfortunate Loyalists". Loyalists were entitled to return home, according to the treaty, but if so, were seized, beaten and robbed.
- Pg. 111 New bills of attainder, in clear violation of the treaty, were brought against prominent Loyalists who were then robbed and driven from homes.
- Pg. 2 General Benedict Arnold -- turncoat and opportunist.
- Pg. 91 Benedict Arnold commanded West Point, the most effective of the American commanders. He offered to sell West Point to the British, the plot became known; his go-between, Maj. John André was hanged. Arnold became an "instant" Loyalist, later planned to move to Canada, died in 1801.
- Pg. 132 The Shelburne settlement was a disaster almost from the beginning . . not enough good farming land. Many newcomers had to wait as long as two years to receive an assignment of land . . for every Loyalist who stayed, ten others found the experience in early Shelburne a brief, bitter nightmare.

TRUE BLUE, The Loyalist Legend [Continued]

- Pg. 134 First Loyalist landing May 4, 1783
- Pg. 143 Land grants were basically made with 100 acres granted to the head of each family plus 50 additional acres for each family member. To encourage disbanding soldiers to settle, the following grants were made: 1,000 acres for field officers; 700 acres for captains; 500 acres to sub-alterns; 200 acres to non-commissioned officers, 100 acres to privates.
- Pg. 190 Huge blocks of land were given to absentee landlords, to "friends of government" and others.

REFUGE, The Loyalists Come to Nova Scotia, Doris Hilchey,

- Pg. 13 From 1776, small groups began settling in Nova Scotia. The exodus had begun as a slow trickle as early as 1774. In the spring of 1783, the exodus swelled to a flood tide which almost swamped Nova Scotia. A large influx in March was followed by a fleet of 20 transports, carrying 7,000 from New York. On May 4, 3,000 reached land at Port Roseway, by mid December 1783 30,000 Loyalists were believed to be in Nova Scotia, the bulk of whom had gathered in and sailed from New York City, the last British stronghold.
- Pg. 9 A decree of 1789 affixed the letters U.E. (United Empire) to their names.
- Pg. 12 Why did they choose Nova Scotia as a refuge? First, for a very practical reason, because it was a comparable British colony close to New York, final point of evacuation by ship. Second, because reports told of waters flowing with fish and forests overflowing with wild game, berries, fruits. We must remember that the Nova Scotia of 1783 covered much more territory than present day Nova Scotia, for it then included present New Brunswick.
- Pg. 44 The 1783 Nova Scotia divided into two provinces, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, 29 May 1784. Also there were nine counties: Shelburne (created by division of Queens), Queens, Lunenburg, Annapolis, Kings, Hants, Cumberland and Halifax divided into Halifax and Sydney counties.
- Pg. 23 The men of the regiment reduced (disbanded) in Nova Scotia were encouraged to remain as settlers. Policy was to settle the soldiers by Corps, close together. The usual Quit Rents were waived for ten years from the date of the grants to Loyalist refugees.
- Pg. 25 On June 25, 1785 (Colonel) John Campbell + 120 received 15,300 acres, River Jordan (Gunning Cove) [Among the 120 were Finlay MacIntosh, a Revolutionary soldier, Robert Inness I, Donald MacKay and Lt. Robert Clarke.]
- Pg. 28 Food rations were not the only provisions paid for by the British government. All sorts of building supplies, tools and farm implements, grain and seeds, iron works for grist and saw mills, tents, small boats, clothing and blankets, even buttons and thread for "indigent Loyalists" were also on the lists. [Refer: PANS Vol. 223, Doc. 110].

THE EARLY HISTORY OF PORT MOUTON, by M. Marie Woodworth, January, 1983
Published by The Queens County Historical
Society, Liverpool, Nova Scotia

The booklet gives very descriptive accounts of the early Loyalist days as grants of land were received, housing, hardships - includes lists of many familiar names, where they received grants, how many acres. The majority of the Loyalist settlers at Port Mouton were disbanded soldiers who had served as members of Tarleton's Legion, plus members of the British Legion who chose to remain at Port Mouton.

(The above booklet is full of descriptive detail, a research addition).

1. While researching church records, MG9, B8, Vol. 16 and 17, attained from the National Archives, Ottawa, Ontario, with births and marriages of the Methodist Church (and nearby localities), Liverpool, Queens County, Nova Scotia, and Trinity Anglican Church Parish, Liverpool, Nova Scotia, I found recording was not as accurate as it should have been. There is nothing that can be done about the records, unless Public Archives of Nova Scotia, Halifax, NS or The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormons) have further history.
2. Solving one problem was simple: My grandfather, William Henry Farquhar was listed as being born twice and baptized twice. see Page 5. William Henry Farquhar was born Nov. 7, 1853, baptized in March 1854. The second recording of his birth was really his sister, ALICE MARY FARQUHAR. Public Archives of Nova Scotia solved this problem.
3. The 1881 Census listed the names of those in households -- checking the census, it seems we now have one extra family - unless the census recorder made an error.

Following Germanic custom (Andrew Hagen was from Wurttemberg, Germany), some of the men have been given the 'family' name JOHN, as in the Conrad History. The Household:-

The above JOHN FARQUHAR could be John Jacob Farquhar -- see Page 14. His wife's name was MARY (Gerhardt) and they had a son, WILLIAM, who died from consumption -- emphasizing the need for a servant.

- Although the ages and years do not correspond, I am satisfied it could have been an error made by the census recorder.
It seems there was only one Farquhar family in this area.

4. One entry lists JOHN HENRY FARQUHAR, his birth and baptismal date, but with no further data, e.g. marriage. The record of deaths was not well kept, and Public Archives of Nova Scotia unearths as much as possible.
5. STEPHEN HENRY FARQUHAR is not recorded with birth and baptismal record. Later data is known about Stephen Farquhar.
6. Personally I feel, knowing of other errors, that Stephen Henry Farquhar is recorded as John Henry Farquhar -- after all, the father's name was John, therefore I will list NEW INFORMATION for Stephen Henry Farquhar.
7. The mother, Susan (Hagen) Farquhar acquired a variety of names, ranging from Johanna, Susannah, Margaret.
This could be from Germanic custom: Johanna is a derivative of Anna;
Margaret a derivative of Margaretha.
8. The birth of their second daughter, SARAH JANE is listed as being the dau. of John and Margaret Farquhar.
9. The birth of their last son DAVID ALFRED FARQUHAR, lists him to be the "7th son of John and Susan Farquhar" -- see above #6.
