Hope this is what you wanted and helps. If I can get hold of additional information I'll send it on. Dot Farquhar Murphy used to come with Pearl a lot but since Pearl married again a couple years ago I don't see either much and poor Dot has been ill again but but of hospital and getting along pretty good I understand. Had a lot of trouble with her back and has to wear a metal thing a lot, she's Donald and Geneva and Marjories sister and lives in Framingham and sees Pearl and a friend of Pearl's Marion Chandler, and Jim and Anna much more than we see her. It's also been too hot to go inland much and Pearl took off for a week in the mountains last week. They fly in when they can and we go there some but this weather stay home or go towards the beach, on cooler days, even though we have air conditioning in the car.

You may know we just got back from another short, quick trip to N.S. We had Bill's brother, Kenneth and his wife Irma, here from W. Palm Beach, Fla. since last of June and all of July. They weren't with us all the time, but a lot of it and we've had other company from Florida to spend a day and Bill's son, wife and baby from the Virgin Islands were here a day, staying on the Cape with Bill's daughter and family and they came toofor the day. Bill's brother and wife have wanted to see N.S. (so they said) for years and now retired wanted to do it.

She retired last year and he had to several years ago and had another bad hemmorhage last Dec. from shoulder to groin, in hospital, had blood transfusions etc.—he only has one lung now too, so he's doing O.K. just now and they wanted to go and we took them in our car. It was O.K. but they didn't cooperate either, very foggy, cloudy, rain in torrents at times, some sunshine but we enjoyed it too and being with them visiting enroute. Bill drove all the way and doesn't mind, but it was rather a long drive, 1806 miles and air conditioner on in car continually. We stopped about 2 hours at Margaret's, then went on to Truro. We were supposed to have reservations at the new Indian Motel, Abernaki, but they were all fouled up and nobody to direct you, place not leveled off yet etc. so we went into Truro for reservations about 4 P.M.—none anywhere, and we were tired then, but went on towards Halifax and out Bedford way we found a place that had some Vacancies, very nice, \$29. each room plus tax but we were glad to have a place to stay—Inn on the Lake (Thomas), but did it pour, the heavens let loose. We had dinner there at 9 P.M. that night but comfortable, and breakfast there next morning.

That was Saturday x morning, July 11th, and I wanted to see your Dad if we could, so after breakfast we went in. Arrived there about % 10 o'clock and your mother had company, a Mrs. Besse (?) Lockhart from Brooklyn and a young woman, Mrs. Fader. We talked quite awhile with her and she explained in detail how your Dad was (Margaret had written and also told us when we stopped he was poorly). Then finally we went up to see him. I thought he looked quite good, and he looked intelligent and I rather think he knew us-perhaps I wanted to think so. I greeted him and tried to talk a bit and he nodded etc. but we were very sad to find him in such ill health. It doesn't seem possible and we still hope he may improve. We didn't stay % long, and after seeing your mother's nice flowers in her garden we went along to New town, near Sherbrook where Ruth and Jean Cameron, our old friends, were expecting us for a few days. Went back by way of Truro because of Fog --no sense in going the Shore road. We ate at Palliser Restaurant at noontime or so and saw the "Bore" come in before we left, around 2:30 P.M. Bill's brother and his wife were much interested in that and we always like to watch it roll in so fast.

I'd wanted to go to Sherbrook but it seems our Companions wanted to go on and by way of P.E.I. home. I was sure we'd never get on the Ferry with our car but off we went early Sat. morning and arrived at Caribou shortly after 9 A.M. One Ferry was leaving, loaded with cars, the wire enclosure was full and about a mile along the road, cars waited to board a Ferry. We'd have been there yet, so just went right along, didn't stop at Margarets. Stayed in Sussex at Pine Cone Motel—a good place by the way, then on to Bangor next day to Susse Chalet Motel—one of the best and cheapest, then home Monday afternoon. We were disappointed not to stay a day or two at New Town but maybe next year we can manage it; best to go by ourselves. Bill doesn't mind driving but a day or two of rest along the way would have been helpful. Seemed they just wanted to go right along, and he not being too well so much she sort of gives in to him, and so did we. In the end they didn't leave until the end of July for Fla.—they drove up in their car but she did all the driving. They were stopping in Williamsburg.

Since we got home we've had nothing but unbearable hot weather. Last Sat. 110 degrees and high dew point and humid. Day and night it'd been in 90's for two weeks and more. Had the fan on in Bill's room all night; it keeps me awake, I slept on porch or other bedroom. It's better today but still hot; we didn't do much, lawns rather burned up. Your mother said you were all well, spoke of young Alex, Jamie, Sarah etc.—hoped you'd be on. I have some arthritis and Bursitis in right arm so excuse errors—it's a good excuse anyway. We'd love to see you anytime—all or any of us. Doris is going through a bit at this time. She's had David's widower brother to care for and take daily to Mass. Gen. Hospital for Cobalt treatments daily, 6 weeks of it, now after 2 wks. rest he's in to have his larnyx removed, but had pneumonia and it's been delayed but not long as operation must take place. Not much hope for a good outcome. Doris & David stopped here on Thursday and looked good but are tired naturally. Betty and family back from Alaska were here and drove her Uncle daily many days; they're retired to Ill. now where they are building and Basil retired from airforce going

into Zerox concern at good salary. Our best to all-hope to see you one day, Love to all, Restispecially to Glennis & Hugh Dot of arrily if you see them
