John Johnson Farquhar

John Johnson Farquhar passed away at Bowden on May 12th, 1956. He was born at Summerville, Nova Scotia, November 7th, 1882. After receiving his Education, he spent a number of years on the farm before answering the Call to the Ministry as a lay supply in 1922. He served two charges in his Native Province before coming to Alberta in 1928. Here he served Brant, Coal Lake, Naco, Rimbey, Gadsby and Bowden. The funeral was held from the Bowden United Church on Wednesday, May 16th and was conducted by the Revs. H.B. Ricker, H.J. Miller, Wm. P. Irving and the President Rev. C.D. Powell. He is survived by his sister Sadie and a brother in Montreal.
