Dad always said we were related to

This is to certify that the above named
James Ross, unmarried, born in this Parish of Dyke, of respectable Parents
who was a constant Resident here until the 20th April 1833 did during his
entire behaviour (so far as to the best of our knowledge) constantly honestly and
quietly go about his business, and was always well behaved of every kind, no malignant or unkind words
or behaviour ever received into any christian society or family, who have been known to him.

I have also given him my certificate of character for the last
number of years and do so for the last two years by appointment of the said

These are to certify that the Declarer thereof James Ross, unmarried, born in the Parish of Dyke, of respectable Parents, and who was a constant Resident therein till the 20th April 1831, did during his Residency always behave himself (to the best of our knowledge) soberly, honestly and discreetly, free from Church Censure and Scandal of every kind, we therefore know no reason why he may not be received into any Christian Society or Family where Providence may order his lot.
