I found these two interesting - never heard  
of a George Faughan in Halifax. - also what caught  
my eye was "native of Forres" - a hop, skip and jump  
from Elgin or Rothes.

The other two items which I haven't copied  
were ① birth of a baby boy to Capt. James Faughan -  
and ③ the same year the marriage of a daughter of his.  
This would be the family of old Capt. Faughan  
of Faughan's wharf - and "Salvage" fame. Perhaps  
the "George Faughan" - was a connection of his ??

These Faughans came from the same area  
of Scotland - so perhaps somewhere way back they  
may have been connected. Names seem to run  
in families.

There are lots of Timmies in Vol I. I haven't  
seen Vols II, III or IV - but I expect there will be  
lots of Smiths there as well.
